For all the tastes and colors of fall, there is no better place than an apple orchard! And Pleasant Valley Orchard offers that and more! Fresh, tree-ripened apples to delight your taste buds, hand-dipped caramel apples full of gooey goodness and beautiful pumpkins are a fall-lovers delight!

It's a place for making memories and a perfect fall outing for the family.

Twenty-five years ago, Jim Birkholz and his wife, Judy Erickson, purchased the 71-acre spread of farmland, with scenic views of the St. Croix Valley and a hillside perfect for growing apples. The first trees were planted in 1990 and since then, the family has worked tirelessly to produce quality fruit and provide a place for families to make lasting memories.

There is so much to do when you come to the orchard! Aside from buying delicious apples and bakery products, you can visit the goats in the Animal Shed and enjoy a scenic walk through the woods on the Nature Trail. Kids love playing in the corn box and hay pile. On weekends, Pleasant Valley Orchard features all kinds of fun activities like pick-your-own apples, live music from local artists, and hayrides to the pumpkin patch!

The list of apples grown include all of the new favorites like Zestar!, SweeTangoTM and Honeycrisp, but we have your classics too, like Haralson, Courtland and Wealthy.

Their most popular apple, though, might be the hand-dipped caramel apple made fresh every week. The bakery also boasts delicious apple pies, apple crisp, turnovers and scones. A trip to the orchard is rarely complete without a bakery treat.



"ERIC NORELIUS - FIRST PERSON" Sunday, October 4 8:30 & 10:45am Services

Pastor Rod Anderson, Gustavus Adolphus College, steps into the historic shoes of Eric Norelius, one of the first pioneer ministers of Chisago Lake Lutheran Church. Eric was from Hassela, Sweden. He will be at both Worship Services. Between services he will be in the Heritage Room. After the second service, (noon) come to a congregational/community potluck lunch in the church Fellowship Hall. Bring anything that you would like to share. Eric (Pastor Anderson) will then share a PowerPoint presentation of this historic work.

Pastor Anderson writes in Eric's words: Dear Scandinavian Friends, "Eric Norelius-FIRST PERSON" is what I call the story of my life and ministry, which I look forward to telling you at your services & lunch! I was the first person to bring the Lutheran Church to the Swedes in Minnesota, 1850s. Chisago Lake was one of my favorite congregations I was called to organize! What times I had gathering the immigrants together into congregations in those early Swedish settlements, finding a home for Gustavus Adolphus College and founding Vasa Children's Home for the little orphaned ones! I'll bring photos and stories! Pastor Eric Norelius*

*aka Pastor Rod Anderson, grew up at Spring Garden Swedish Ev. Lutheran Church near Cannon Falls, MN, and served St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Eden Prairie for 34 years, and then Gustavus Adolphus College as Interim Sr. Chaplain for 2 years. Pastor Anderson will be in 1854 clergy attire, complete with the beard to fit the person and character. Co-coordinated by the Chisago Lake Lutheran Church Historical Committee. 
