Exciting Changes at CLGC! Course Improvements Underway

For years golfers and staff alike have talked about how nice it would be to have a bunker running down the right side of #4. How it would speed up play, how great it would look from the tee, and by the way, it might catch our balls from bouncing into the swamp. Well that day has come! It will take a few weeks to get it shaped. It will be built up a little on the right side to keep balls from going into the swamp. We hope to be able to play it by the end of September.

The other nice improvement is the fairway bunker on hole #1. The beginning of this bunker will be about 275 yards from the blue tee and about 200 yards from the green tee. It may only come into play for the big hitters or when the wind is blowing the right way. It will serve as a good aiming point and may force you to concentrate a little more if you are laying up from the right side. The cart path on the right will be rerouted and the fairway extended to the right to create a wider landing area off the tee.

The other less exciting but equally important improvements are the surface drainage areas added to hole #1 and hole #5. On hole #5 it will allow for better drainage left of the green. This area then should be able to be mowed down so you would have a better chance of playing a shot from down there.
